Analysis of Feedback sought (Criterion I: Curricular Aspects):

The feedback committee and IQAC design feedback questionnaire structure. The teaching faculty increased their ICT based teaching-learning process in qualitative and quantitative manner as well. The Placement Cell of the college conducted campus interview drive this year and 19 students were selected in the process. The Parent-Teacher Association and Alumni Association of the college jointly organized parent, alumni and teachers' meet. All the participants in this meet appreciated the disciplined atmosphere of the college. These are the salient features of the feed backs collected.

One faculty member is the chairman of the BoS in Political Science of the Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Those who are not associated with such BoS committees of the university corresponds their recommendations to their concerned BoS in the university and the recommendations, if selected appear in the next revised syllabi of the university.

Department of Chemistry has devised one short term course *Preparation of Household Chemicals* of 3 months duration. It is a self-funded course and Part III students are admitted for this course. Besides, other departments designed and introduced skill based capsule courses. It has been the outcome of planning of the faculty in the department in the wake of the feedbacks collected under the present criterion.

Process of the Practice	Faculty in the department invites students admitted for vocational course in "Electronics Technology" in this college. The training program has been set of one week duration acquainting and training these students with hardware parts cleaning CD/DVD, Hard-Disk replacing and other parts repair. This course is conducted either in the first or second semester of a year.
Impact of the Practice	The students of vocational course in Electronics Technology to (10+2) level and this missing aspect of training hardware repairing could equip them for seeking job in market on priority basis.
Evidence of Success	Evidence of its success lies with the batches passed through during this training course.
Resources Required	At the initial stage the students were reluctant. They did not know how much such training could help them at seeking job in market. We explained them importance of skill of repairing hardware. This course required one old (out of use) CPU and one more CPU in use. The training was conducted with the help of these two devices.
