ICSSR New Delhi Sponsored Two Day National Seminar on
“Agricultural Transformation and Rural Development in India:
Issues, Challenges and Possibilities”

Agriculture is pivotal to India's economy, employing nearly half of the workforce and ensuring national food security, even as urbanization trends reduce the rural population to approximately 70%. Mahatma Gandhi's belief that “the future of India lies in its villages” underscores the importance of rural development. Despite its significance, agriculture faces numerous challenges, including inadequate public investment, underdeveloped supply chains, rising input costs, and diminishing farm sizes, which exacerbate poverty and inequality. For the explore the multifaceted issues surrounding agricultural transformation and rural development in India and it will address critical themes such as the role of both farm and non-farm sectors in the rural economy, sustainable agricultural practices, food security, and the socio-economic impacts of agricultural changes department of economics organized ICSSR New Delhi Sponsored Two Day National seminar entitled “Agricultural Transformation and Rural Development in India: Issues, Challenges and Possibilities” on 12th 13th March, 2025 collaboration with IQAC.

In the keynote address Prof. Dr. V. B. Jugale emphasized the need for a paradigm shift in Indian agriculture, moving from traditional practices to modern, technology-driven, and sustainable farming methods. He highlighted the importance of integrating scientific advancements, such as precision agriculture, biotechnology, and digital tools, to enhance productivity and efficiency. He identified key challenges, including fragmented landholdings, inadequate access to credit and markets, climate change impacts, and the lack of infrastructure. These issues, he argued, hinder the growth of rural economies and perpetuate poverty. Also Prof. Dr. V. B. Jugale stressed the importance of policy reforms to support small and marginal farmers. He called for better implementation of government schemes, improved access to institutional credit, and the promotion of farmer-producer organizations (FPOs) to empower rural communities. Dr. V. B. Jugale advocated for organic farming, water conservation, and the use of renewable energy in agriculture. He also emphasized the



importance of inclusive growth to ensure that the benefits of transformation reach all sections of society.

The first technical session of the National Seminar chaired by Prof. Dr. S. B. Akash, from the Rani Channamma University, Belgavi and he focused on the critical topic of Agricultural Transformation and Pricing Policy. Prof. Dr. S. B. Akash opened the session by emphasizing the significance of fair and transparent pricing policies in ensuring farmers' income security. He highlighted how pricing mechanisms influence crop choices, market dynamics, and overall agricultural productivity. The volatility of market prices and the lack of effective price stabilization mechanisms were identified as major challenges affecting farmers' incomes. Strengthening agricultural markets through the implementation of the e-NAM (National Agricultural Market) platform and promoting direct farmer-consumer linkages were discussed. The session highlighted the potential of digital tools and data analytics in improving price discovery and transparency.

The second technical session led by Dr. N. D. Gawali from D. A. V. Velankar College of Commerce, Solapur and he focused on the topic Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Rural Development. Dr. Gawali began by outlining the interconnectedness of the SDGs with rural development and he emphasized that rural areas are central to achieving goals such as No Poverty, Zero Hunger, Clean Water and Sanitation, and Decent Work and Economic Growth. Despite being an agricultural powerhouse, India faces challenges in ensuring food security and nutrition due to inefficiencies in distribution and access. Unsustainable agricultural practices and climate change pose threats to SDG 13 (Climate Action) and SDG 15 (Life on Land). Inadequate rural infrastructure, including healthcare, education, and sanitation, affects the achievement of multiple SDGs. He discussed the potential of sustainable farming practices, agro ecology, and climate-resilient crops to contribute to Zero Hunger, Climate Action, and Life on Land. Government Schemes like MGNREGA, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, and National Rural Livelihood Mission were discussed as critical tools for poverty alleviation and rural development.

The third technical session led by Prin. Dr. Yojana Jugale and she focused on the topic Marketing Policies of State and Central Government. Prin. Dr. Yojana Jugale began by emphasizing the critical role of marketing policies in ensuring fair prices for farmers, reducing post-harvest losses, and improving market access. She highlighted how effective marketing systems can bridge the gap between producers and consumers, benefiting both farmers and the economy. The lack of integrated markets and the dominance of intermediaries were identified as major issues affecting farmers' income. Poor storage facilities, transportation, and cold chain infrastructure lead to significant post-harvest losses. Fluctuating market prices and the absence of effective price stabilization mechanisms were discussed as persistent challenges. Small and marginal farmers often face difficulties in



accessing larger markets due to information asymmetry and logistical barriers. The session highlighted the potential of e-NAM (National Agricultural Market) in creating a unified national market for agricultural commodities, enabling transparent price discovery and reducing intermediaries. Lastly Prin. Dr. Yojana Jugale highlighted the need for policy reforms, infrastructure development, and the adoption of technology to create a robust and farmer-friendly marketing ecosystem.

In the research paper reading session nearly 48 research papers read by the researchers, Academicians and Professionals.

The fourth technical session chaired by Dr. R. J. Patil from Rani Parvatidevi Arts and Commerce College, Belgavi and she discussed on the topic Development of Agro-Processing Entrepreneurship. Dr. Patil began with highlighting the significance of agro-processing in reducing post-harvest losses, increasing farmers' income, and creating employment opportunities in rural areas. He emphasized that agro-processing is a critical link between agriculture and industry, contributing to the overall development of the rural economy. Inadequate cold storage, warehousing, and processing facilities were identified as major bottlenecks. Limited access to credit and high capital requirements hinder the growth of agro-processing enterprises. The lack of technical knowledge and entrepreneurial skills among rural populations limits the development of agro-processing units. Weak market connections and limited access to larger markets affect the profitability of agro-processing ventures. Complex regulations and licensing processes create barriers for small and medium enterprises. The discussions provided actionable insights for stakeholders to promote agro-processing as a driver of rural economic growth.

The valedictory function of the National Seminar chaired by Dr. A. K. Patil and discussed the topic of Development of Agricultural Labour Problems. Dr. Patil began by emphasizing the crucial role of agricultural laborers in India's farming sector. He highlighted that despite their significant contribution to food production and rural economies, agricultural laborers often face poor working conditions, low wages, and limited social security. Agricultural laborers often earn low wages, which are insufficient to meet their basic needs. The absence of healthcare, insurance, and pension schemes leaves laborers vulnerable to economic shocks. Dependence on seasonal work leads to income uncertainty and underemployment. Many laborers migrate to other regions for work, where they face exploitation and poor living conditions. Women laborers often face wage discrimination and additional burdens of unpaid domestic work. Dr. Patil discussed how agricultural transformation, including mechanization and technological advancements, has led to reduced demand for manual labour. While these changes improve productivity, they also exacerbate unemployment and underemployment among agricultural laborers. Dr. Patil summarized the discussions from the seminar, reiterating the importance of addressing issues such as pricing

policies, agro-processing, rural infrastructure, and sustainable development to achieve agricultural transformation and rural development. The valedictory function concluded with a call for holistic and inclusive approaches to address the challenges faced by agricultural labourers and the need for policy reforms, social security measures, skill development, and community empowerment to improve the livelihoods of agricultural labourers and ensure their participation in India's agricultural transformation.

Finally two day national seminar is over the vote of thanks of convener of the seminar Dr. Amol Kamble.
