4. **Competency-Based Learning:** The focus on competency-based education could lead to a more practical and skills-oriented approach, helping students gain hands-on experience and apply theoretical knowledge in real-world scenarios.
5. **Enhanced Critical Thinking:** Emphasizing critical thinking and problem-solving can improve students' analytical abilities, enabling them to tackle complex biological issues more effectively.
6. **Increased Research Opportunities:** NEP 2020 encourages research and innovation. An updated syllabus might include more research-based projects or collaborations with other institutions, offering students valuable research experience early in their academic careers.
7. **Emphasis on Experiential Learning:** The policy advocates for learning through experience, which could lead to more fieldwork, practical labs, and real-life case studies in the Zoology curriculum.
8. **Improved Employability:** By incorporating skills relevant to current job markets and aligning with industry needs, the revised syllabus could enhance students' employability and readiness for diverse career paths.

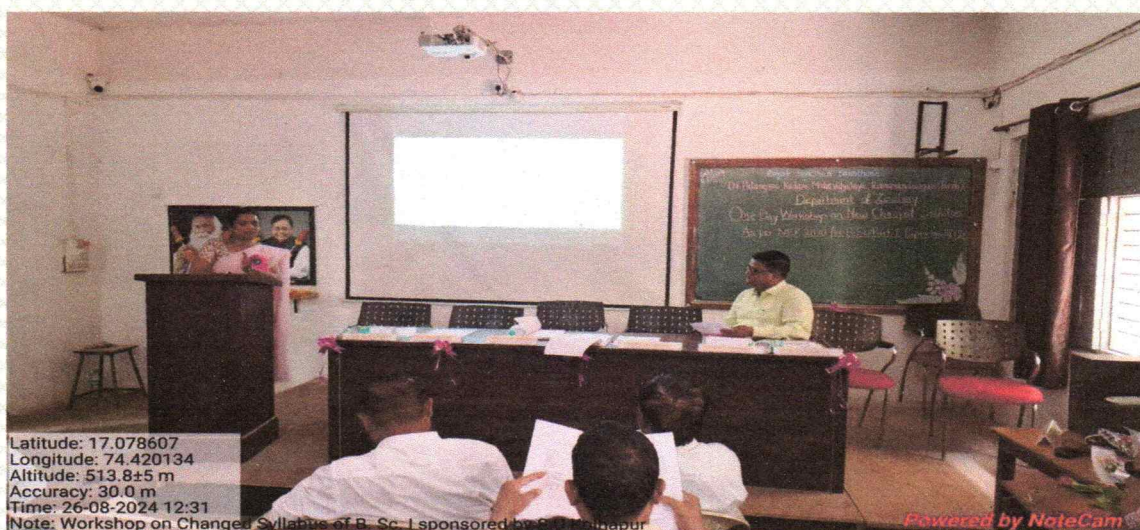

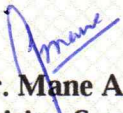
